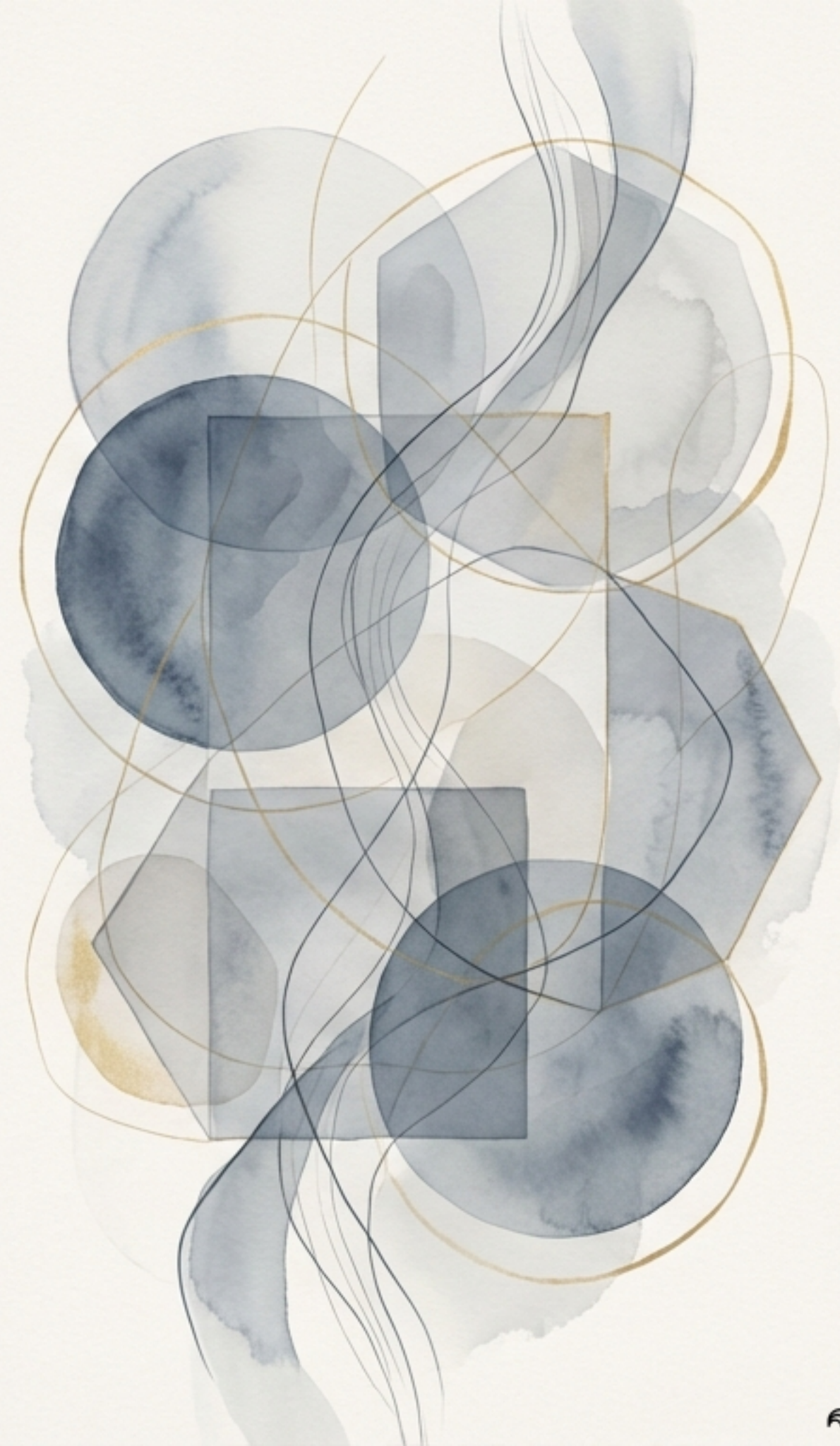

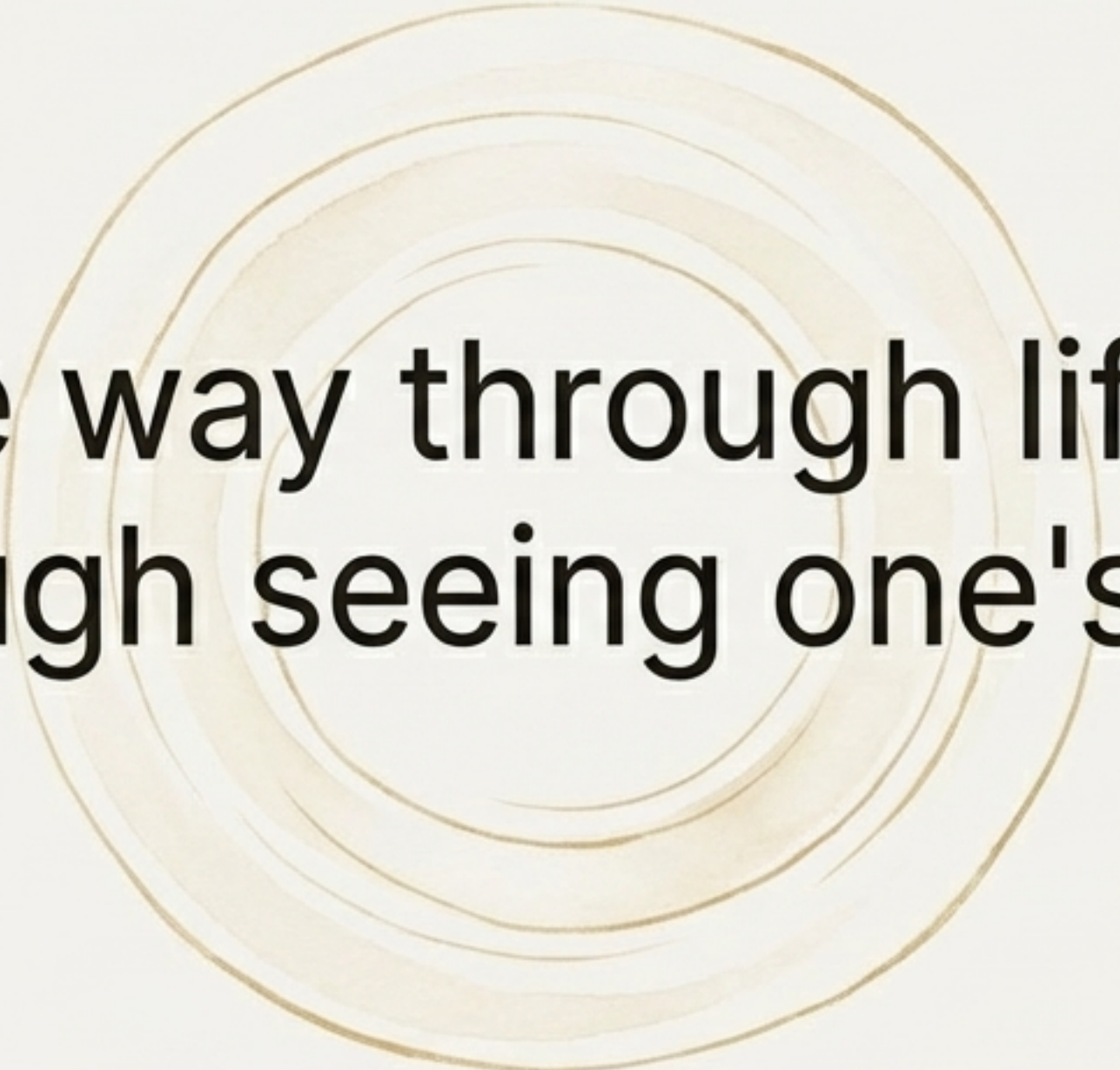
As civic and business leaders, you dedicate yourselves to service and uniting for good.

The Process of Seeing

Seeing yourself is an active, internal process. It involves asking fundamental questions about ourselves, while staying in contact with three key anchors as they shift within us:



Breath: The rhythm of life.



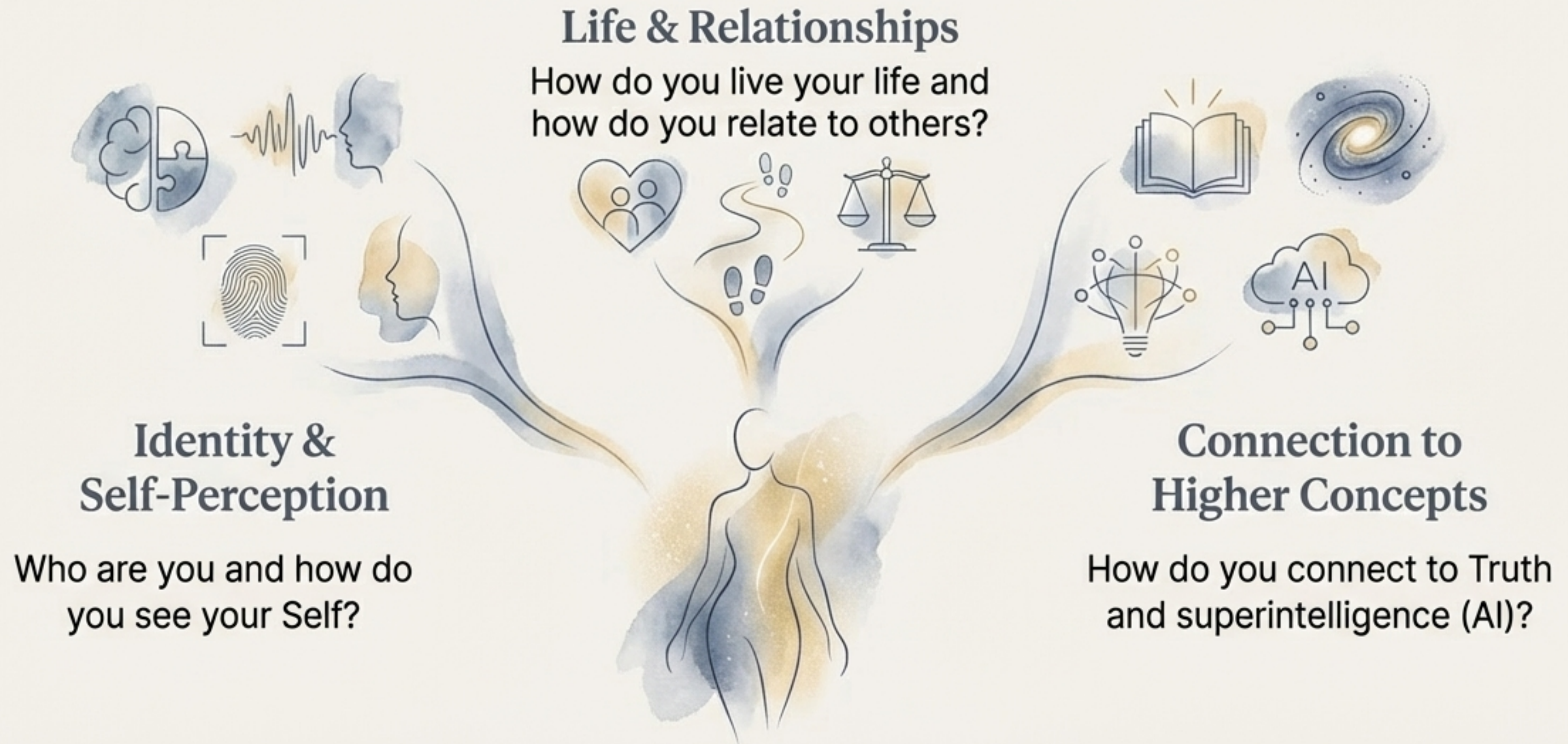
Sensation: The body's direct experience.



Sense of Identity: The feeling of 'I'.

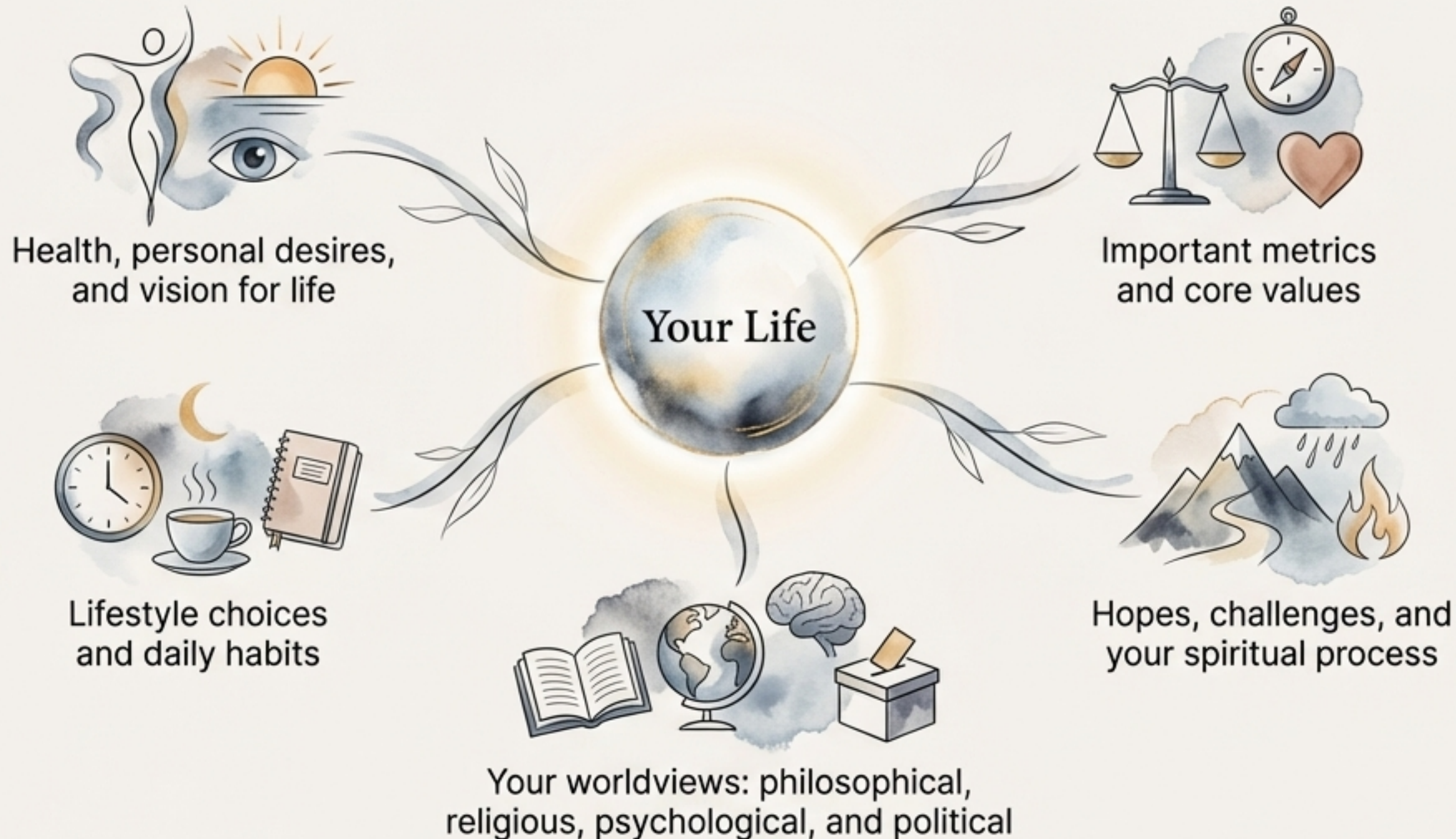
Through this semi-structured process, a broader perspective naturally arises, and a clearer trajectory begins to reveal itself.

The process is the result.

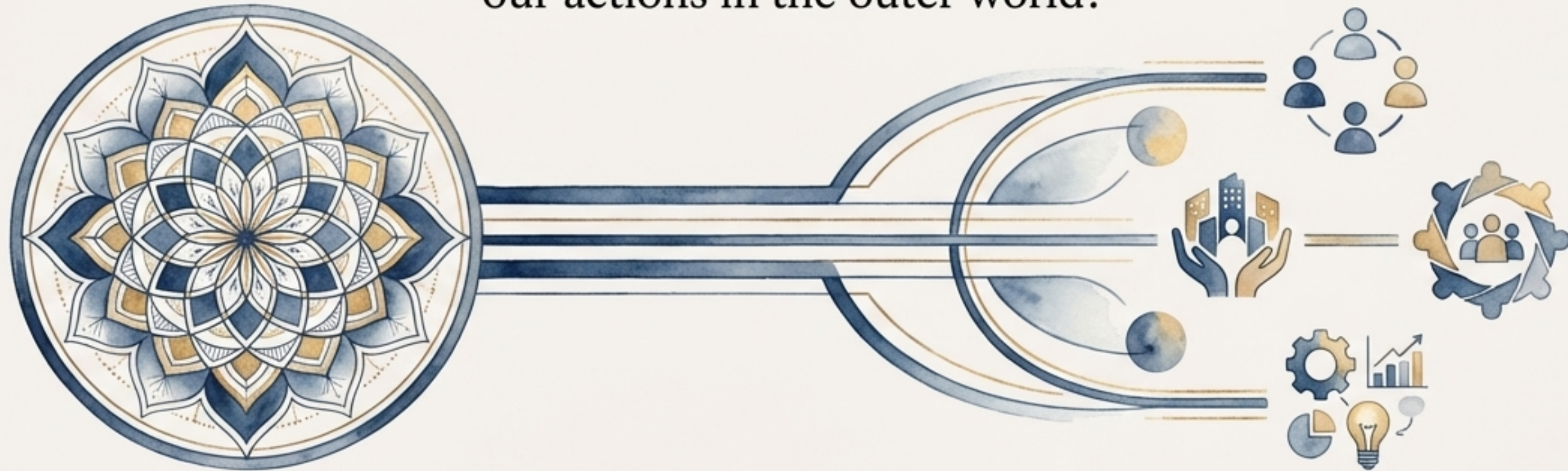
The means is the end.

Mapping a Rotary Perspective: “Service Above Self”

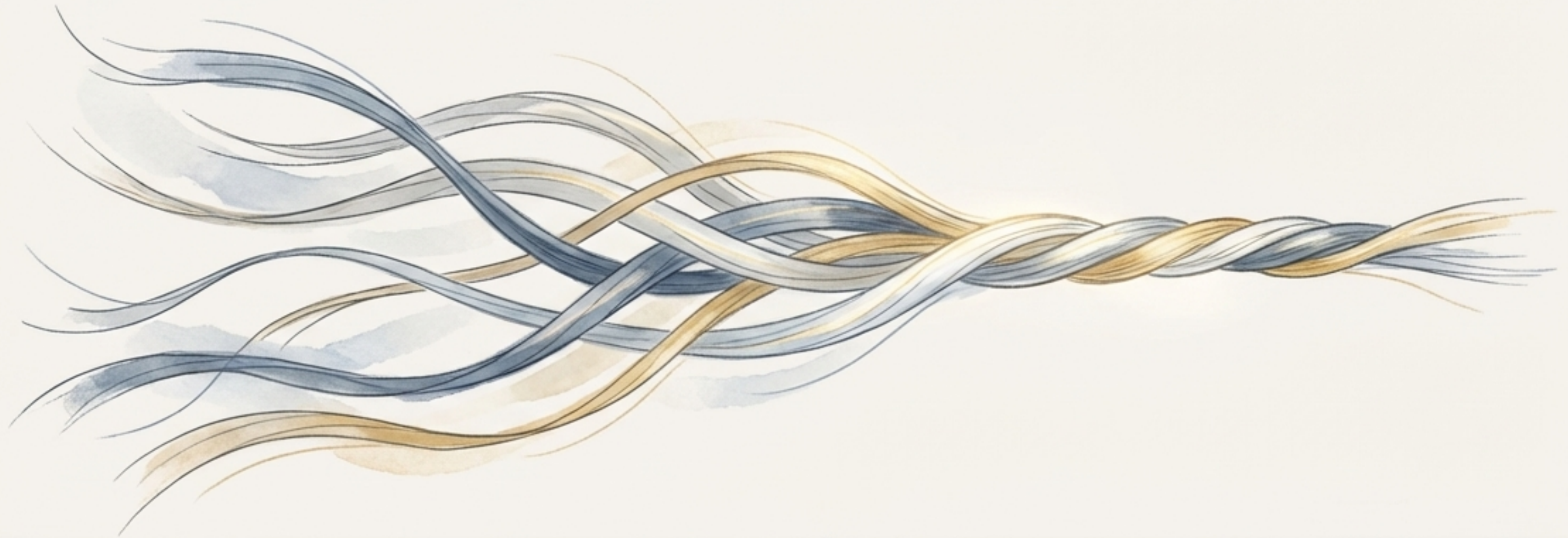
Let’s apply this process to a core Rotary value. Consider these questions:



1. What does the concept of ‘Self’ in ‘Service Above Self’ mean to me, personally?
2. Where does my inner state—my stress, my peace, my ambitions—show up in my acts of service?
3. How can a clearer understanding of my Self enhance my capacity for selfless service?

Mapping a Rotary Perspective: “Unite for Good”

To unite with others, we must first understand the perspectives operating within ourselves.



1. What inner biases or assumptions might I hold that create barriers to unity?
2. How does seeing my own inner conflicts help me mediate disagreements within our community?
3. What is the “Good” we are uniting for, and how does it align with my deepest personal values?

The Most Essential Capacity

For civic leaders today, the most essential capacity is recognizing what is actually operating within us.

Nothing new needs to be believed or adopted.

This capacity for self-seeing is already within you.
The work is simply to create the space to access it.

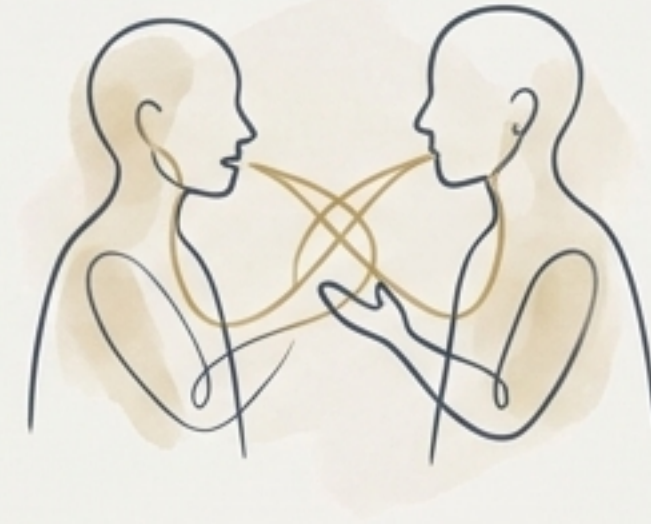
